

New Master's degree programme in Public Mental Health launching at the University of Turku

The perspective of public mental health has been lacking in the higher education in Finland and also in most other countries. Moreover, research is needed on mental health service systems, interventions, and prevention. The University of Turku has taken on the challenge, and will start to educate public mental health specialists.

The first application round for the Master's degree programme in Public Mental Health is on 3-17 January 2024.

The Master's Degree Programme in Public Mental Health will educate research and healthcare development and administration professionals. The programme will prepare students to work e.g. as epidemiologists, researchers and health care service managers at a vast array of organisations including public and private healthcare, federal government, universities and companies.

The Master's programme is hosted by Research Centre for Child Psychiatry and is organized together with the Flagship INVEST Research Centre providing a new model for the welfare states that is more equal, anticipatory and both economically and socially sustainable.

The new Master's Degree Programme will welcome its first students in August 2024.
